- Between 7:00 and 7:30, enjoy a delicious **pizza supper at Goodfella's**. Pizza, salad, and non-alcoholic beverages are included with your event registration.
- Explore on your own!

Take a walk through the space overlooking the Town Branch, soon to be featured in a linear park through downtown Lexington.

Other venues you may want to visit: Middle Fork Kitchen, Ethereal Brewing, The Break Room, Crank and Boom Ice Cream Shop.

If you're still adventuring, follow Marilyn to the Henry Clay Public House downtown to hear the Nick Stump Blues Band – Marilyn will be singing a few tunes between 9 and 10!

*Advance registration includes the Barrel House Distillery Tour (6 or 6:30 tour times), free music at the Elkhorn Tavern, and a delicious supper at Goodfella's (between 7:00 and 7:30) including salad, pizza, and non-alcoholic fountain drinks. Participants are encouraged to explore other destinations – but note that these are not included in the registration fee.

DIRECTIONS to the Distillery District

Drive (or Über, Lyft, Carpool) straight down Newtown Pike toward town, about 3 miles. (1228 Manchester is a good address to use with Google maps.) Newtown Pike becomes Oliver Lewis Way at the Main St. intersection.

Go straight over the new Oliver Lewis Bridge (with the lights that are supposed to evoke bourbon barrels – you be the judge).

Turn right at Manchester, at the end of the bridge, and follow Manchester for .7 miles. (Don't panic – it's a little dark but you're almost there!)

The James Pepper Distillery District is on your left. There is not a big sign, but as you approach you'll see on your left a huge brick building with a giant black, white, and red mural that looks vaguely menacing. Turn left immediately after the mural and park in the big lot, wherever. You've arrived!
